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BROOKLYN TODAY SEPT. 27

Good morning. Today is the 270th day of the year. The Brooklyn Daily Eagle for Sept. 27, 1870, discussed how the section between Warren Street, Ninth Street, Prospect Park and the Gowanus Canal — roughly Park Slope — had improved within the previous 10 years. In 1860, the Eagle wrote, the area was dominated by forests, fields and a few old houses that dated back to the Revolutionary War. Since then, according to the article, thousands of buildings had been constructed, from wood-frame cottages to brownstones. "Hills have been leveled, hollows filled, muddy marshes made firm and solid, streets have been paved and graded, and dashing horsecars have replaced lumbering farm wagons," it read.

Well-known people who were born today include singer and actor Shaun Cassidy ("The Hardy Boys"), baseball executive Steve Kerr, rapper Lil Wayne, actress Jayne Meadows and Hall of Fame baseball player Mike Schmidt.

Today is the deadline for submissions to the Brooklyn Chamber of Commerce's "Made in Brooklyn" competition, aimed at highlighting the borough's food, design and tech sectors. The Chamber will honor manufacturers who made products in the borough in these fields at its Annual Meeting and Trade Show in October. ... Today, an art exhibition called "For & About: Art & Reactions to Superstorm Sandy" will open at BAC Gallery. The exhibit, which will close next February, features artwork by 14 Brooklyn-based artists. BAC Gallery is at 111 Front St., DUMBO.

Downstate Receives \$1.5M For HIV Care

SUNY Downstate Medical Center, located in Brooklyn, has received an award of \$1.5 million from the AIDS Education and Training Center (AETC) Program of the federal Health Resources and Services Administration to educate and train physician assistants (PAs) in HIV/AIDS care and treatment.

The project will be conducted by SUNY Downstate's Special Treatment and Research (STAR) Program, a multidisciplinary component of the Department of Medicine, in collaboration with the Physician Assistant Program in Downstate's College of Health Related Professions. The project will address the shortage of trained HIV healthcare care providers and receive \$300,000 a year for five years.

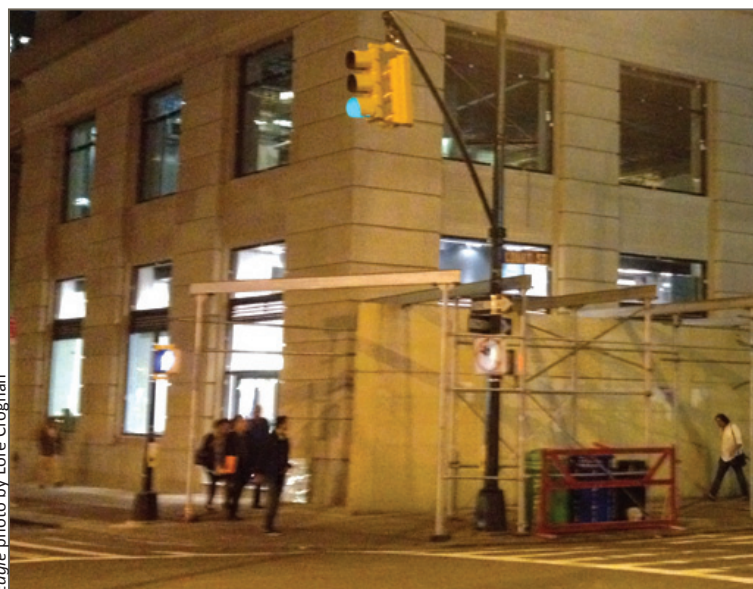

Brooklyn Shows 'Genius' with MacArthur Winners

No-Strings Fellowships for Artists, Scientists and Achievers

Brooklyn has a flair for genius: Nine of the 24 MacArthur Fellows who will be receiving so-called "genius grants" this year are from the New York area, and four of them hail from Brooklyn.

Visual artist **Carrie Mae Weems**, fiction/nonfiction writer **Donald Antrim**, fiction writer **Karen Russell**, and dancer/choreographer **Kyle Abraham**, all called "exceptionally creative," will receive the coveted no-strings-attached MacArthur grants, which amount to \$625,000 paid out over five years.

The grants are meant to give winners the freedom to follow their own creative vision.

Outside of Brooklyn, other New York-area winners include Jeremy Denk, pianist and writer; Vijay Iyer, jazz pianist and composer; Julie Livingston, public health historian and anthropologist; Sheila Nirenberg, neuroscientist; and Alexei Ratmansky, choreographer.

While the world thinks the grants are given to "geniuses," that term is too narrow, says the MacArthur Foundation. "We are looking for individuals who are engaged in the process of making or finding something new, or in connecting the seemingly unconnected in significant ways. We are looking for

people on the precipice of a great discovery or achievement."

Winners are chosen in a process involving thousands of expert and anonymous nominators and evaluators. From 2001 to 2012, 36 percent of the MacArthur fellows came from the arts and humanities, 36 percent from science or social science, and 26 percent worked on social problems such as homelessness, food security and health care.

Brooklyn's MacArthur Fellows:

Writer **Karen Russell's** acclaimed first book "Swamplandia!" was a finalist for the 2012 Pulitzer Prize in fiction. Her native Florida and the mysticism of the Everglades inspired the work, which delves into a southern subculture unknown by the rest of America. Russell won the 2012 National Magazine Award for fiction. "Vampires in the Lemon Grove" is her most recent story collection.

Photographer and video artist **Carrie Mae Weems** (who splits her time between Brooklyn and Syracuse) explores African-American identity, class and culture in documentary-style works. Her art incorporates folklore and experimental printing methods. Largely overlooked for decades, her work ("Ain't Joking," 1987; "The Kitchen Table Series," 1990; "From Here I Saw What Happened and I Cried,"

1995; "The Louisiana Project," 2004; "Roaming," 2006) tackles the subjects of race, class and gender discrimination.

Kyle Abraham is a choreographer and dancer who runs his own dance company, Abraham.in.Motion on Dean Street in Brooklyn. He's originally from Pittsburgh, and overcame a tough childhood that often inspires his work, which delves into issues like gang and police violence. Abraham's dance blends formal technique and informal styles like hip-hop. A 2012 Jacob's Pillow Dance Award recipient, he is currently working on a commission by Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater.

Donald Antrim ("The Verificationist," "The Afterlife: A Memoir" and a frequent contributor to *The New Yorker*), called a "writer's writer," is deeply admired by the likes of Jonathan Franzen, George Saunders and Jeffrey Eugenides, and has received numerous awards and grants. He is a professor at Columbia who is deeply committed to his students, and he is currently working on a new novel and collection of short stories. His unusual style blends tightly controlled prose with comic absurdity and surreal events.

Just One Chance to Preview Governors Island Park Site

And It's This Weekend

What a weekend it's shaping up to be. Events include not only the Atlantic Antic and the DUMBO Art Festival in Brooklyn, but also an opportunity to preview the new \$250 million park construction site at Governors Island.

Visitors will be allowed to walk where they like or take a guided tour to see the transformation of acres of landfill into beautiful parkland. Staff will be on hand to answer visitor questions. While the construction of Phase 1 should be completed this fall, this weekend's preview is the only one scheduled.

Phase 1 creates 30 new acres of park (and updates 37 existing acres) at the heart of the island. Eventually the park will encompass 87 acres of parkland and public space.

Phase 1 includes:

- **Liggett Terrace:** a sunny, 6-acre plaza that features moveable seating, public art, water features and seasonal plantings
- **Hammock Grove:** 10 acres with 1,500 new trees and hammocks
- **Play Lawn:** 14 acres including lawn and two turf ball fields
- **Historic District:** 34 acres of "respectfully rejuvenated" landscapes with new welcoming gateways, flexible spaces for play and new signage,

lighting and amenities.

In July, Mayor Michael Bloomberg broke ground on The Hills, called the crowning feature of the new park. Made of recycled construction and fill materials, The Hills will rise 25 to 80 feet above the Island, and the summit of the tallest Hill will provide visitors with a 360-degree panorama of the Statue of Liberty, New York Harbor and the Lower Manhattan skyline.

The park construction site will be open from 12 to 6 p.m. both days. Visitors can enter the site at the Liggett Hall Arch. Guided tours will leave from the Arch as well at 1:30 and 3:30 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday.

New York Sets Up 'Health Exchanges'

Even as the debate over "Obamacare," or the Affordable Care Act, still rages on Capitol Hill, some of the much-touted "Health Exchanges" are now being established. One of these exchanges is being set up in New York state effective Oct. 1, but not many people know the details.

To this end, the New York State Department of Health, which is setting up the exchange in this state, has created a name for the program, "NY State of Health," and a website, <http://www.nystateofhealth.ny.gov>. While many of the details are still being worked out, the website seeks to answer many often-asked questions.

According to the site, "NY State of Health is an organized marketplace designed to help people shop for and enroll in health

insurance coverage. Individuals, families and small businesses will be able to use the Marketplace to help them compare insurance options, calculate costs and select coverage online, in-person, over the phone or by mail.

"The Marketplace will also be able to tell what type of financial assistance is available to applicants to help them afford health insurance purchased through the Marketplace."

While enrollment begins Oct. 1, the program will not be effective until Jan. 1, 2014. It is geared for small businesses that may not be able to afford coverage for their employees, and for individuals under 65 who don't now have coverage and who are not eligible for Medicare.

People with pre-existing conditions, the website stresses, are eligible to apply – some private insurance companies will not insure

people with these conditions.

The program is being developed with more than \$368 million in federal grant money as well as a grant from the non-profit Robert Wood Johnson Foundation.

The site also has a county-by-county feature, and specifies those insurance companies that are offering plans in Kings County. Each plan will be available in four "tiers": bronze, silver, gold and platinum.

These include, for individuals: Affinity Health Plan, EmblemHealth, Empire Blue Cross/Blue Shield, Fidelis Care, Health Republic (Freelancers), Healthfirst, MetroPlus Health Plan, Oscar and United.

For small businesses, the following companies are offering plans: Health Republic (Freelancers), MetroPlus Health Plan and United.

As More States Back Casinos, Inequality Rises

What once happened only in Vegas – casino gambling – is clearly no longer staying in Vegas. Since 1990, nearly half of American states have allowed casinos to open. And the trend keeps feeding itself. More states are now competing to lure gamblers from neighboring states and to rake in big revenues from casino profits.

People in the Northeast and mid-Atlantic states can now easily drive to a casino. New York may soon join Massachusetts in jumping on the trend. But a visitor to a casino won't find the average American there. Casinos draw a disproportionate number of low-income workers, retirees, minorities, and disabled people, according to a new report by the nonprofit Institute for American Values.

And because almost all gamblers lose more than they win, and because today's slot machines are designed to keep people playing, these states have become co-conspirators in today's economic and social inequality.

"State sponsorship of casinos is a policy contributing to patterns of inequality in America," according to the report, which was endorsed by 33 scholars and based on numerous studies in the United States and elsewhere.

Atlantic City's high unemployment rate in 1978 – the excuse to open casinos there at the time – is still nearly the same. Casinos cannibalize surrounding businesses. They increase the number of compulsive gamblers within 50 miles of them. A study by Baylor University economist Earl Grinols found gambling creates \$3 in social costs for every \$1 it generates. The very term "gambling" has become so associated with problems that the industry tries to persuade journalists and others to use the word "gaming."

The report points out that the leading funder of gambling research is the gambling industry, which only skews how state officials weigh the long-term disadvantages of casinos and other forms of gambling. The industry also tries to convince states that negative effects can be contained and managed, like a regulated brothel on the far side of town.

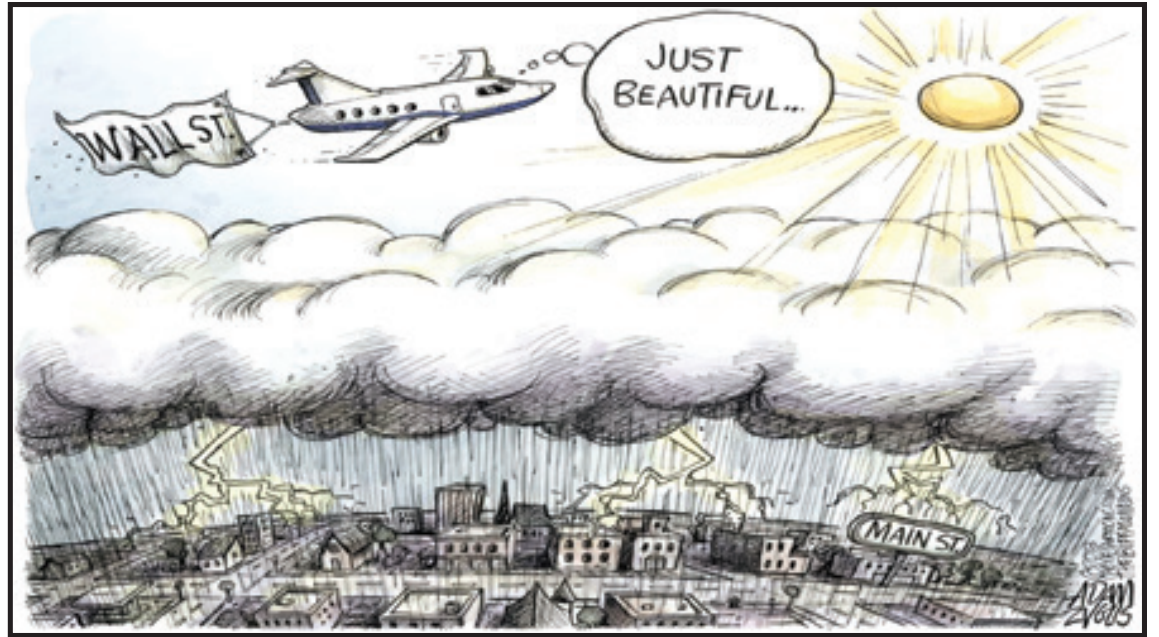
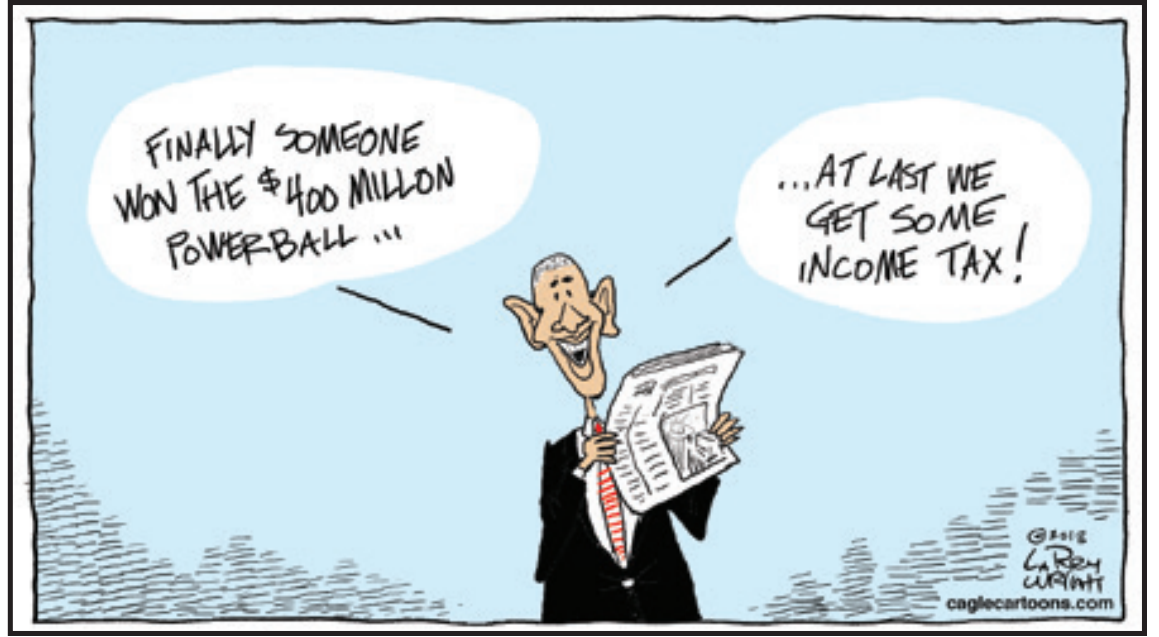
Independent research on gambling is rare in the U.S. Other countries, such as Britain and Australia, are far ahead in tracking gambling's effects. Various studies, for example, show that 35 to 50 percent of casino revenues come from habitual or pathological gamblers, many of whom ruin their lives or the lives of loved ones. Do states really want to be a party to that? And pick up the social costs?

"Casinos are now popping up across the nation, near a shopping mall or a river dock near you, with the full support and sponsorship of the very state governments that only yesterday had outlawed them," says the report.

In their rush to sponsor casinos, states rarely do enough homework or ask the right questions. The evidence for casinos adding to inequality is becoming clearer. But the report also asks if states can answer this important ethical question: Do casinos help erode the idea – one that is essential to democracy and a market economy – "that what happens to us depends more on what we do than on whether we are lucky?"

Humanity's progress was not accomplished through a belief in chance. History is made by smart thinking, not dumb luck. States that give a nod to casinos are heading for the wrong side of history.

The Best of Frenemies: Knicks, Nets Call Off 'Cold War' To Host 2015 NYC All-Star Weekend

There were no cutting words exchanged by high-powered owners, not a sign — or billboard — of contention, and nary a boast or barb to be heard as the Brooklyn Nets and New York Knicks declared that there would be three days of peace between them come the winter after next.

Our city's NBA teams literally met in the middle Wednesday afternoon at Washington Street's Industria Superstudio in Greenwich Village, declaring a detente in their ongoing feud for local bragging rights by officially revealing that they would share co-hosting duties during the NBA's All-Star Weekend from Feb. 13-15, 2015.

"Each of them were very receptive to the idea," NBA commissioner David Stern said after confirming that he had brokered a Glasnost between Knicks owner James Dolan and the Nets' Mikhail Prokhorov in advance of the landmark announcement. "They thought it would be a good idea to get together, that's all."

Getting together hasn't exactly been on the dueling owners' agenda since Prokhorov became principal owner of the Nets nearly four years ago.

The Russian billionaire appeared to take great pleasure in tweaking his East River rivals whenever the opportunity presented itself, posting his infamous "Blueprint for Greatness" billboard outside of Madison Square Garden back in 2010 and calling Dolan a "little man" in a *New York* magazine article.

Knicks players like Ray Felton and J.R. Smith have taken turns reminding the Nets that they are still, and perhaps shall always remain, our city's "other team."

Newly acquired Brooklyn forward Paul Pierce has returned the not-so-friendly fire by declaring that there will be a new sheriff in town, as well as the Atlantic Division, once the opening tip on the 2013-14 campaign goes up just over a month from now.

But the acrimony between the two factions couldn't stand in the way of what promises to be three nights of sold-out arenas during the league's annual All-Star extravaganza.

Stern and his eventual successor, NBA deputy commissioner Adam Silver, revealed that the 64th edition of the All-Star Game would be played on the hallowed hardwood of "The World's Most Famous Arena" on Feb. 15, 2015.

In turn, the Barclays Center will host a slew of events — Rising Stars Challenge, 3-Point Shootout, Slam Dunk Competition, etc. — leading up to the big game on both Friday and Saturday night.

"The All-Star Game [is an opportunity] to take a timeout from the rhetoric to promote basketball," Dolan insisted when asked about his perceived feud with Prokhorov. "[Rivalries] are nothing but good, they're nothing but fun for the fans and they are great for business."

Prokhorov, who was unable to attend the announcement ceremony, did issue a statement regarding his agreement to play nice-nice with Dolan and the Knicks, albeit for a span of 72 hours some 17 months from now.

"We are thrilled to welcome the 2015 NBA All-Star festivities on Friday and Saturday to Barclays Center," he said. "Brooklyn has produced some of the greatest players in NBA history, so it's fitting to hold All-Star events in the 'Borough of Basketball.' We are looking forward to showing fans and the players a memorable experience in our state-of-the-

art venue, and we are also excited to bring the All-Star Game to Barclays Center in the very near future."

Neither Stern nor Silver intimated that the Nets and Knicks would reverse roles the next time the All-Star Game landed in the Big Apple. But many believe this deal was reached with the unwritten agreement that the Barclays Center would eventually host the All-Star Game itself while the Garden plays host to the surrounding events, possibly as soon as 2017.

"We're not ready to be specific yet but there will be an opportunity for Brooklyn to host the game," Silver, who will succeed Stern after this coming campaign, admitted.

"Three or four years ago this seemed impossible," added Downtown developer Bruce Ratner, who launched the plan to build the arena and bring the Nets to Brooklyn when he took ownership of the struggling then-New Jersey franchise back in 2003.

"Barclays Center is proud to wel-

come such an exciting event as All-Star '15 and to continue bringing the best to Brooklyn," he added. "We are delighted to join with New York City, the NBA and Madison Square Garden for a wonderful weekend. Basketball may have been invented in Springfield, Mass., but its heart and soul are in NYC through and through."

Though there was a one previous split of All-Star Weekend venues in Dallas in 2010, with the Mavericks' American Airlines Center hosting All-Star Friday and Saturday before the All-Star Game was played at brand new Cowboys Stadium, this will be the first time two NBA franchises split the festivities.

"New York offers an extraordinary opportunity to host NBA All-Star events at two world-class venues," explained Stern. "We look forward to celebrating our game

the five boroughs led by the NBA, which has a terrific record of giving back. We're thrilled and looking forward to cheering on the stars."

"We are honored to host the greatest players in the NBA in the newly transformed World's Most Famous Arena for the 2015 All-Star Game," added Dolan. "Over its 134-year history, Madison Square Garden has been privileged to host some of sports most defining and enduring moments and we are thrilled to add this prestigious event to The Garden's illustrious history. We look forward to working with the City of New York, the NBA and the Brooklyn Nets to make the event a celebration of basketball for all New Yorkers to enjoy."

Fortunately, the press conference of peace won't stand in the way of what promises to be the

most intense season of New York basketball the city has ever seen.

Both teams will open training camp next week, and will begin their respective 82-game campaigns in just over a month.

The Knicks and Nets will hash out their issues on the court four times during the regular season, and if we're all lucky, will meet again in a best-of-7 Eastern Conference playoff series next spring.

Dolan, who has been on the receiving end of Prokhorov's playful taunts the past few years, did get one veiled jab in at his adversary during Wednesday's lovefest.

When asked what he got out of the meeting with Prokhorov at the commissioner's office, the Garden chief had two simple words: "Free lunch!"

Not exactly fighting words, but a reminder that there is still plenty to play for between the Knicks and Nets from now until February 2015.

And, fortunately for NYC hoops fanatics, it appears there always will be.

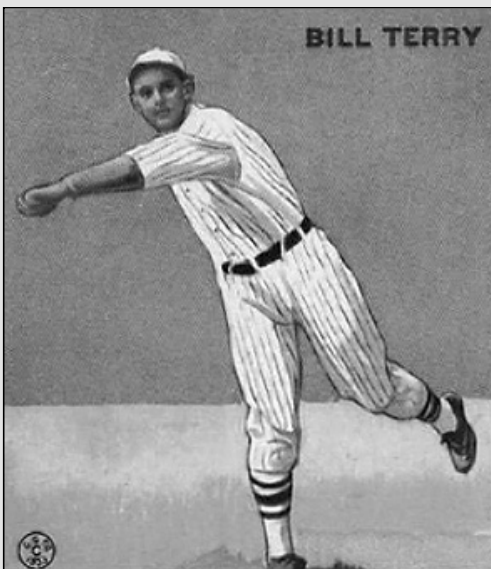

Let There Be Lights



BROOKLYN — The new Daylight Saving Time was heartbreaking for one N.Y. Giants player in the second game of a season-ending doubleheader at Ebbets Field on September 27, 1931. Bill Terry might have won a batting title except the game was called by darkness (the lights did not come to Ebbets until June 15, 1938). Terry needed one hit to win his second straight National League hitting crown. He was 1-for-4 in the opener that the Brooklyn Dodgers won 12-3, and 1-for-2 in the nightcap with the Giants ahead, 6-1, when play was stopped in the fourth. St. Louis' Chick Hafey wound up at .3489 to Terry's .3486. Terry had won the 1930 batting title with a .401 mark. He went on to become manager of the Giants during which they earned three pennants. Terry has a place of honor on the National Baseball Hall of Fame.

Hero Faces Son's Murderer

BRONX — On the night of March 1, 1932 the 20-month-old son of Charles and Anne Morrow Lindbergh was kidnapped from their rural New Jersey home. The decomposed body of the baby was found not far from the Lindbergh home on May 12. Police broke the case in 1934 when a German-born carpenter named Bruno Richard Hauptmann spent a ten dollar bill from the ransom transaction and another \$30,000 of bills turned up at his home. On September 27, 1934 Charles Lindbergh and the accused Bruno Hauptmann came face to face. Frank Emery wrote the following account of the meeting for the *Brooklyn Daily Eagle*:

"Wearing smoked horn-rimmed glasses and with a cap pulled down over his eyes, Col. Charles A. Lindbergh today confronted Bruno Richard Hauptmann in a dramatic scene. It came just before the kidnaping suspect was arraigned in Bronx County Court, where a price of \$100,000 was set for his liberty in bail.

"Whether there was any recognition on Colonel Lindbergh's part, District Attorney Samuel J. Foley declined to reveal.

Suspect Remains Silent

"Weary and shaking but maintaining his sullen silence, Hauptmann gave no indication of being aware that the disguised figure mingling with the score of detectives and factotums in Mr. Foley's office was the father of the child with whose kidnaping and murder he is linked.

"The meeting, which had been arranged with great secrecy, took place at 10 a.m. and lasted 10 minutes, during which the prosecutor put a few perfunctory questions to Hauptmann so that the flier could hear him talk.

"Colonel Lindbergh peered at the prisoner intently but gave no indication of his thoughts. He conferred briefly with Mr. Foley and left the Bronx County Building.

"When the \$50,000 ransom was paid, Colonel Lindbergh, seated in his car 100 feet away, saw a man standing watch. He was believed to be an accomplice of the mysterious "John" who received the package of gold notes.

Prisoner Can't Raise Bail

"Hauptmann was unable to supply the \$100,000 bond for his freedom, and his counsel, James M. Fawcett who sought futilely to have the bail lowered to \$5,000, expressed no hope that it could be raised."

Although Hauptmann protested his innocence to the end (a belief many still hold to this day), he was convicted of murder and executed in 1936.

Booth's New York Days

On Sept. 27, 1850, the great American actor Edwin Thomas Booth (1833-1893) made his New York City debut at age 16

as Wilford in the play *The Iron Chest* at the National Theatre.

After Edwin Booth's brother John Wilkes assassinated President Abraham Lincoln in 1865, he retired from the stage but returned in 1869 to open his own theater, which was a financial failure.

In order to recover his losses, he toured the U.S. from 1873 to 1879 and later appeared in England in repertory performances. Following his debut in England he became one of the leading figures on the New York stage.

Edwin took over managership of the Winter Garden Theatre in Manhattan in 1863, leasing the house in 1864, intending to "establish the pure, legitimate drama in New York."

It was on the Winter Garden's stage on Nov. 25, 1864, that Edwin and his two brothers, John Wilkes Booth and Junius Brutus Booth Jr., appeared together in a performance of *Julius Caesar*.

In 1869, Edwin erected his temple to Shakespeare and

Melpomene [a muse in Greek mythology] on the southeast corner of 23rd Street and Sixth Avenue and opened it as Booth's Theatre to a chorus of unbridled superlatives from everyone who attended the inaugural performance.

Booth's dream of a perfect theatre, however, vanished in a five-year saga of unending mischance.

In 1877, Steele MacKaye took over the Madison Square Theatre and redesigned the interior to incorporate his innovations and inventions, which were ultimately adopted by other theatre builders.

Edwin Booth consented to play Petruchio in an abridged version of *The Taming of the Shrew* at Madison Square for a performance to benefit the erection of an Edgar Allan Poe memorial statue.

The Brooklyn Academy of Music has the distinction of presenting Edwin Booth's last performance, as Hamlet on April 4, 1891. Edwin Booth died on June 7, 1893.

Writer of *U.S.A. Trilogy* and More

Prolific Author John Dos Passos Lived in Brooklyn Heights

“A writer who writes straight is the architect of history.” This was the well-worn mantra of John Dos Passos.

Artist, activist-journalist and author, Dos Passos published over 40 books in his lifetime before dying on Sept. 28, 1970.

The illegitimate son of John Randolph Dos Passos, a successful lawyer married to a mentally ill woman (which made divorcing her illegal at the time), and Lucy Addison Madison, John Roderigo Madison was born in Chicago on Jan. 14, 1896.

Known as Jack or Dos throughout his life, his relationship with his father, whom he called “The Commodore,” and his mother, who suffered from heart attacks, was as secretive as it was itinerant. Leaving Chicago for Europe, where his parents’ relationship could be public, young Dos experienced what he later called “a hotel childhood” — touring Paris, Brussels and London. His parents were married in 1910, after his father’s first wife died.

After beginning his education in London, Dos attended Sidwell Friends School in Washington D.C., then finished at the Choate School in Connecticut in 1911, at the age of 15. Accepted into Harvard, he waited a year before enrolling, and went sailing in the Mediterranean with an uncle to study art, architecture and the Old World.

By the time Dos completed three years at Harvard, he was itching for more experiences outside the classroom and traveled to California after his mother died in early 1915. His father demanded that he complete his degree and he did, but didn’t stick around to receive his diploma in 1916.

Published in *The New Republic*

Dos set sail for Spain on Oct. 14, 1916 — the same day *The New Republic* published his first paid piece, entitled “Against American Literature.” He lost his father to pneumonia in early 1917. Though his father was fairly wealthy when he died, Dos would see hardly \$15,000 over the next two decades. Only in the late 1930s did Dos learn that relatives in trust of the estate had hidden over \$100,000 of his inheritance.

Longing for experience, Dos joined the American Ambulance Corps during World War I and trained near Paris in 1917. Three weeks of action in August gave him enough material for multiple books, including his 1919 debut novel *The Scene of Battle* and critically acclaimed *One Man’s Initiation*, released in 1920.

In the Ambulance Corps he made new friends, including E.E. Cummings and Ernest Hemingway, as well as earned a near dishonorable discharge. Disgusted by “the lies and cant of officials,” Dos wrote a coarse letter home, which was confiscated by the Red Cross.

Still more travels followed — Florence, the Middle East — as well as battles with publishers over content. The release of his third novel, *Three Soldiers*, in 1921 was a success, with most reviewers raving.

110 Columbia Heights

By 1922 Dos was living in New York at 3 Washington Square with friends in E.E. Cummings’s former wife’s apartment. Painting and planning his first exhibition at the Whitney Studio Club in January of 1923, Dos sent invites to friends, adding to F. Scott Fitzgerald’s, “Come and bring a lot of drunks.”

Fame as an artist was fleeting, and the first of many bouts with rheumatic fever and arthritis soon struck, sending Dos to the hospital, then to Brooklyn to recover in early 1923. Letters to friends instructed: “When you come to New York I’ll either still be in the Midtown Hospital 231 E 57th Street or I’ll be recuperating at 110 Columbia Heights Bklyn.”

Owned by the Opffer family, 110 Columbia Heights would host multiple famous scribes over the coming years. Dos Passos would be the first, then poet Hart Crane in 1924.

Hemingway and Fitzgerald were closest to Dos. He was at one of the bull fights depicted in *The Sun Also Rises* and, in 1930, Dos dragged Hemingway out of a car crash in Montana.

Starting the book he’d envisioned in Brooklyn, Dos moved to New Orleans in 1924 to write for the leftist

publication *New Masses*, then returned to New York and Rockaway Park to complete *Manhattan Transfer*.

Arguably Dos’ masterpiece, the story of Bud Korpening’s struggle to escape punishment for his abusive father’s murder by becoming “No more’n a needle in a haystack” in New York City showed Dos Passos’ emerging experimentalism.

As Bud falls from the Brooklyn Bridge, so too dies a dream of justice and individuality. Released in 1925, *Manhattan Transfer* signaled a new voice in American fiction.

Settling in Provincetown, Massachusetts, from 1925-1926, Dos soon found love with Katherine “Katy” Smith, a magazine writer who was a childhood friend of Hemingway’s. The two were wed and returned to 110 Columbia Heights in 1927 to start the New Playwrights Theatre, at 306 West 52nd St. in Manhattan.

Sacco and Vanzetti

The year 1927 was the most public time for the reserved writer. From 110 Columbia Heights Dos launched a fierce campaign to save Ferdinando Sacco and Bartolomeo Vanzetti. Laborers and anarchists accused of robbery and murder, Sacco and Vanzetti became the focus of an international uproar. Most likely innocent, both were executed on Aug. 23, 1927, but Dos continued to champion causes.

In addition to exposing injustice and enraging the establishment, Dos was reinventing literature by using a stream-of-consciousness style and recurring characters for his novels *The 42nd Parallel* (1930), *Nineteen Nineteen* (1932) and *The Big Money* (1936), which would become his U.S.A. Trilogy. Intermixing advertising, propaganda and war-reels, Dos brought a sort of multimedia approach to his novels.

“A satirist is a man who can’t see filth, oppression, and the complacency of the powerful, the degradation of the weak without crying out in disgust.” Just one of his many meditations on government and society, “Between Two Roads,” appeared in the Saturday Review of the *Brooklyn Daily Eagle* on Feb. 4, 1934.

Travels to Spain

What Dos saw in his travels to Spain in the late 1930s would alter his beliefs — and writings — forever, as well as end a close friendship. Dos was planning to make the movie “The Spanish Earth” with Hemingway to offer “a view of Europe’s ruins.” Both Dos and Hemingway were there to cover the Spanish Civil War. An old friend of Dos’ had been killed but the facts were elusive; Dos wanted an investigation and to publish the results but Hemingway accepted the government’s version of events and tried to restrain Dos. Disenchanted, the two parted ways and rarely spoke again.

Dos’ work for leftist and Communist causes also soon ceased; in the early 1950s he would actually endorse the McCarthy hearings and recant his prior written support for such causes.

Adventures of a Young Man was released in 1939 to poor reviews and magazine assignments became few and far between. Instead of reacting, Dos began researching American history for *The Ground We Stand On*, then offered dispatches from the Pacific during World War II for *Life* magazine.

Many point to this period as a downward spiral for Dos. The loss of his wife and his right eye in a car crash in late 1946 seemed to signal the end.

Living in Palisades, New York, and elected to the American Academy of Arts and Letters (nominated by Sinclair Lewis, Carl Sandburg and Eugene O’Neill), John Dos Passos was being honored but dismissed as passé.

“Heart fits” were recurring by the late 1960s and, in one of his last letters — this one nominating William F. Buckley for membership in the Century Association — Dos seemed to sum up his own extraordinary life and legacy.

“I hope you will remember that when you are inviting someone to join the Century you are not inviting a bundle of current notions but an entire man with his past behind him and his future before him.” John Dos Passos died of heart failure three months later, on Sept. 28, 1970.

Our Heroes in Victory Parade

BROOKLYN — On September 26, 1941 came a PROCLAMATION from Brooklyn Borough Hall, signed by Borough President John Cashmore which read: "Proclamation. To the people of the Borough of Brooklyn. WHEREAS, The Brooklyn Dodgers, under the leadership of Leo Durocher, have brought to our Borough its first National League Pennant in twenty-one (21) years, and WHEREAS, every one of Brooklyn's three million citizens are justifiably proud of their great baseball team, and WHEREAS, it is fitting that the Dodgers be honored for their long and courageous pennant fight, now, therefore, be it PROCLAIMED that Monday, September 29th, 1941, is hereby designated BROOKLYN DODGERS DAY, and the people of Brooklyn are hereby urged to do their part in making this day one to be remembered by hanging out flags and joining in the demonstration for Brooklyn's heroes of 1941." (Signed by John Cashmore, President of the Borough of Brooklyn).

And celebrate they did. From an account on the front page of the *Brooklyn Eagle* of September 29, 1941:

"Dodgerville tossed aside its dignity today and in an enthusiastic burst of triumphant bands, flying banners and deep-throated cheers, saluted our great baseball heroes in Brooklyn's largest parade since the Armistice [November 11, 1918].

"A voluble proud army of more than 60,000 men, women and children, bright in every color of the rainbow, marched from Grand

Army Plaza, with the National League champions near the front in automobiles, while cheering crowds packed the sidewalks, hurled confetti and screamed: 'Murder those Yankees!'

"As the crowds jammed the streets earlier police estimates were quickly revised and police declared that easily more than 1,000,000 men, women and children greeted the champions. Police officials said the reception by far exceeded that [August 5, 1938] given to Wrong-Way Corrigan, the ocean flier.

"As the crowds along Flatbush Ave. and Fulton St. caught sight of Durocher, Reiser, Reese, of Medwick, Wyatt, Higbe, of Camilli, Fitzsimmons, Owen, they shouted their tribute, waved flags and tooted horns.

"Nobody in that mass of men, women and children cared a whit about any notables. What notable could match a Dodger?"

"The kids howled their adoration and the Dodgers waved back, gulping at the grand reception. At that, it was difficult to place the adults and the youngsters in separate divisions — everybody was hailing the champs.

"Marching, dancing, the scheduled line of 12 abreast sometimes erupted into 15 and 20 as emotional fans burst through the police lines to join the triumphant procession.

"At the head of the cavalcade was a band of mounted policemen, their horses prancing to the sound of horns, trumpets and drums. The cops laughed and sometimes joined in the hurrahs, pointing to the many banners on the street which exhorted 'Beat the Yankees.'"

The World Series began on October 1 at Yankee Stadium at an opener which jammed the park with 70,000 spectators. It was the first time the Dodgers had a chance to beat the Yankees and win the series. But alas, in the fourth game the Yankees were victorious with a three-game-to-one lead. Just imagine what a day Brooklyn would have had if the Dodgers had won the World Series!

Landmark Bridge Over the Gowanus Dates From 1889

BROOKLYN — On September 29, 1987, the Carroll Street Bridge was designated a landmark. Located at Carroll Street and 2nd Avenue in Carroll Gardens, this historic bridge spans the Gowanus Canal, built in 1889 as part of Brooklyn's network of industrial waterways.

George Ingram was the engineer-in-charge. The waters of the canal became polluted and no longer carried to the inland heavy industrial barge cargo. The bridge remains unique unusual: it is the oldest known "retractile" or sliding bridge (there are 3 others nationwide) in the nation as well as one of the oldest extant bridges in New York City.

Made of steel, it sits on wheels and rolls horizontally onto land whenever a ship needs to pass through the canal.

Progress is being made in dredging, tunneling and cleaning up the canal.

Even wildlife has been seen returning to the once-much polluted waters. Community activists are advocating a future park-like atmosphere along the banks complete with shops and restaurants.



DeCorsia Played A Wide Range of Character Parts



BROOKLYN — Ted de Corsia was born Edward Gilda De Corsia in Brooklyn on September 29, 1903. Ted's career was in radio until age 45, when he launched a successful career in films as a character actor. He was chunky, thick necked, black-haired and he managed to scowl and bluster his way through more than 50 films. His very first film experience was in making two short features in which he did not appear but did the narration: "Brooklyn USA" (1947) and "Brooklyn Makes Capital" (1948). His raucous voice, set features and slitted eyes made him a favorite for aggressive gangster roles, and he is best remembered for his first role in *The Naked City* ('48) which was filmed entirely on location in New York City. He played the role of Garzah, a murderer who is chased by the police. A film reviewer commented: "He flees for his life, with police hot in pursuit through the streets and on the elevated trains of Manhattan, a spectacular chase that culminates on the high girders of the Brooklyn Bridge, where cops are forced to shoot the killer to death." His many other films include: *5 Card Stud*, *Nevada Smith*, *The Quick Gun*, *Gunfight at the O.K. Corral*, and *Baby Face Nelson*. He has played gangsters, a judge, an Indian chief, a policeman, a professor, ship captain and many other roles.

In 1955 Howard Hughes produced the film *The Conqueror* on location in Utah, 136 miles from a hugh atomic test site. Of 220 who worked on the film, 90 contracted cancer, half of which died later. The more notable who later died were Dick Powell (who directed the film), John Wayne, Susan Hayward and Agnes Moorehead. The film was a notorious flop. Ted de Corsia's part in the film was father of Susan Hayward but luckily he did not contract the deadly cancer. He died in April of 1973 of natural causes.

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Parole Officer's Presence Was Not Sufficient for Search of Parolee's Home

The Brooklyn Appellate Division has granted the suppression of evidence found in a parolee's home after it was determined that the presence of a parole officer alone, without any reason for the visit, was not sufficient to justify a search.

In 2007, detectives were given a tip that Benjamin Marcial, on parole for criminal sale of a controlled substance, was responsible for a series of burglaries within Brooklyn. Police detectives contacted Marcial's parole officer and asked that she accompany them to Marcial's apartment, fully aware that the purpose of the visit was to determine whether or not Marcial was a viable suspect.

Upon arriving at Marcial's door, the parole officer informed him that she was there merely to conduct a home visit and that the accompanying police detectives were simply working with her. The truth was the reverse — that it was the parole officer who was working with the detectives. Marcial, acknowledging the presence of law enforcement officers, granted them entry into his home, where a number of items reported stolen were found. Marcial was subsequently taken to the police station, where he confessed to committing the burglaries.

Convicted of burglary, Marcial appealed, arguing that he did not give consent to the search of his home. He further argued that the detectives' entry into his apartment was an unlawful police intrusion. As a parolee, Marcial is "obligated to allow

his parole officer to enter his home to conduct a home visit and conduct a related search of his residence," the Appellate Division panel noted in its per curiam decision.

Brooklyn prosecutors argued that "the warrantless search was reasonable under the Fourth Amendment because [Marcial], as a parolee, had a diminished expectation of privacy, and the parole

officer had the lawful authority to enter [Marcial's] residence, accompanied by the detectives, because the entry was reasonably and rationally related to her parole duties."

While there is a requirement to allow a parole officer entry for a routine home visit, consent to search the home cannot be presumed when the officer's entry is made under false representation. In Marcial's case, his parole officer did not inform him that she was assisting the police in their search for evidence to implicate Marcial in the burglaries.

Marcial did not voluntarily consent to the entry and search of his home, the court ruled. Rather, the court found, he merely acquiesced to the authority of his parole officer. As such, the appellate panel determined that the prosecution "failed to prove the lawfulness of the entry into [Marcial's] apartment."

Finding that the search of Marcial's home was unlawful, all evidence discovered during the search was deemed "fruit of an illegal seizure" and therefore inadmissible.

Alexis Ascher and Paul Skip Laisure of Appellate Advocates represented Marcial. A spokesperson from the Brooklyn D.A.'s office said they are reviewing the Appellate Panel's decision.

B'klyn Man Charged in Suspected Honor Killing

Mohammad Ajmal Choudhry was arraigned Wednesday in Brooklyn Federal Court and appeared in the courtroom of Brooklyn Federal Judge William Kuntz II on Thursday on a superseding indictment charging him with conspiring to commit murder in a foreign county, transmitting threats via interstate communications and visa fraud.

According to the superseding indictment and other court filings submitted by the government, Choudhry's daughter, Amina Ajmal, was held against her will in Pakistan for more than three years by relatives at her father's direction. During that time, Ajmal, a U.S. citizen, was forced into an arranged marriage with a Pakistani national for the purpose of obtaining a U.S. visa for that individual.

Ajmal eventually escaped Pakistan and returned to the United States with the assistance of a cousin and U.S. State Department officials. During subsequent recorded telephone calls between Ajmal and Choudhry, the defendant threatened to orchestrate the murder of Ajmal's cousin if Ajmal, whose whereabouts remained unknown to the defendant, did not return immediately to the family home in Brooklyn. On Feb. 25, 2013, after Ajmal refused to return home, Ajmal's cousin's father and sister were shot and killed in Pakistan.

According to an eyewitness, Choudhry's brother was observed standing over the victims, holding a gun and desecrating the bodies. Agents from HSI and the Diplomatic Security Service placed Choudhry, 60, under arrest in Brooklyn later that same day.

"As alleged, the defendant viewed his daughter as a commodity to be bartered. When she escaped those holding her overseas and fled to safety in the U.S., the defendant enlisted his confederates to retaliate against those who had helped her to freedom," said United States Attorney for the Eastern District Loretta Lynch. "As a result of his plot, two innocent people were murdered in Pakistan."

"There is nothing less honorable than the murder of innocent people," said Homeland Security Investigations New York Special Agent-in-Charge James Hayes.

Assistant United States Attorneys Amanda Hector, Richard M. Tucker and Margaret E. Gandy are prosecuting the government's case.

Accountant Arrested In Madoff Fraud

A senior partner at a Manhattan accounting firm was arrested Thursday on charges he participated in and helped direct false book-keeping during Bernard Madoff's historic fraud.

Paul Konigsberg was held for an arraignment in federal court in Manhattan, where an indictment charged him with conspiracy to falsify records, conspiracy to commit fraud, falsifying records of a broker-dealer, falsifying record of an investment adviser and falsifying statements.

Konigsberg, a lawyer who was a senior tax partner at the accounting firm Konigsberg Wolf & Co., is the only person outside the Madoff family to have held an ownership interest in Madoff's private investment business, the indictment said.

It said Madoff, who is serving a 150-year prison sentence after admitting the fraud in 2009, steered some of his most important customers "in whose accounts Madoff executed the most glaringly fraudulent transactions" to use Konigsberg as their accountant.

By the time Madoff was arrested in December 2008, Konigsberg Wolf handled accounting duties for more than 300 of Madoff's private securities accounts, court papers said.

As Waterfront Developments Flourish, 1 Bklyn Bridge Park Needs New Retail

Sheepshead Bay Blues: Sandy Still Leaves Behind Sour Notes

It's game on at One Brooklyn Bridge Park.

The developer of the luxury condo conversion at the south end of the ever-more glamorous waterfront park has hired a new leasing agent for a fresh campaign to find tenants for 68,000 square feet of vacant retail space in the nearly empty base of the building.

CPEX Real Estate Services has the exclusive assignment to market the space at 360 Furman St., the 14-story former Jehovah's Witnesses book plant at the foot of Joralemon Street that developer Robert A. Levine bought for \$205 million in 2004 and turned into 438 condos.

"It is a big deal in terms of its scale - and it has awesome visibility and onsite parking," said Timothy King, CPEX managing partner. "For shoppers, that is huge."

The building has a 500-car parking facility with an additional 132 parking spaces reserved for building residents.

"It's a unique location - and now the park is much further along in its development. That will make it more appealing to tenants than it was a year or two ago," King said.

There's foot traffic - meaning potential customers - from the park that wasn't there before.

Still, he cautioned, "it's been vacant a while, and it's going to take time to find the right tenants."

The park is going to be "book-ended," he said - with One Brooklyn Bridge Park to the south and the massive Empire Stores restoration and redevelopment project on the north.

Park construction is full speed ahead. Earlier this week, BBP issued a request for proposals for the long-term lease, development and operation of a marina adjacent to Pier 5, which is right behind One Brooklyn Bridge Park.

As with all the residential developments being allowed inside BBP, annual contributions from One Brooklyn Bridge Park help pay for park maintenance.

The search for tenants for The Shops at One Brooklyn Bridge Park began in early 2007 - but was put on hold when the economic downturn hit in 2008, published reports indicate.

Though a new leasing push began in late 2009, the first two tenants didn't sign on until 2011: Waterfront Wines and Spirits and a pet spa, Brooklyn Bridge Bark, which is now called WAG Club. At this point, they are the only retailers in the mammoth 1 million-square-foot building, which has 14-inch-thick concrete walls.

Some interior demolition is going on this week inside the empty retail space. One of the storefront windows still has a for-rent sign with the name of previous leasing agent Winick Realty Group on it.

For the brokers from CPEX who are now handling the job, the plan is to make food businesses prominent players at One Brooklyn Bridge Park. They will aim for "multiple themed restaurants" and a supermarket - but not Fairway because its Red Hook store is too close by or Whole Foods because of the store it's building in Gowanus, King said.

They'll also go after coffee shops, juice bars, schools, gyms and day-care centers.

The leasing team of CPEX managing director Ryan Condren and associates Kristina Triglia and George Danut divvied up the ground-floor space into several smaller storefronts of about 3,000 to 5,000 square feet apiece and a large site of more than 30,000 square feet. A second-floor space of 15,000 square feet can be combined with 1,575 square feet on the ground level. There is also a 3,600-square-foot lower level space.

Asking rents are \$35 to \$50 per square foot on ground and second floors.

A number of retail leasing firms competed for the assignment from The Spandrel Group LLC, the property manager affiliated with One Brooklyn Bridge Park's developer.

FRANCHISEES BET ... ON BETTING PARLOR SITE

Dr. Ayman Farag, the member of the franchise group who did the space search, wanted to find a location near Court Street, said Robert Hebron V of Ingram & Hebron Realty, who represented the tenant in the 10-year lease deal.

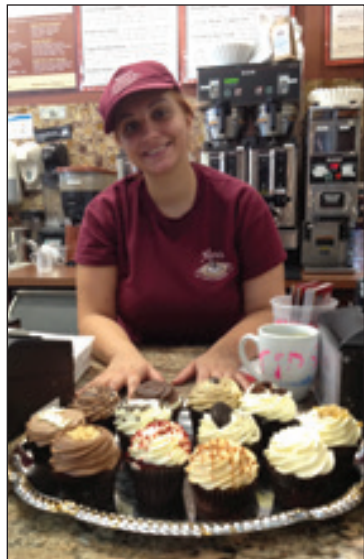
Out of a half-dozen spaces Hebron showed him, Dr. Farag chose the OTB site because of its proximity to the courts, numerous parking garages and Gold's Gym, there's a lot of foot traffic.

cases of the eatery, which celebrated its grand opening last week.

The asking rent for the 1,300-square-foot space was \$55 per square foot, according to an online posting. David Rivera Jr. of All Points Realty/BPC Management represented the building owner, which is a partnership headed by BPC Management president Douglas Rosenberg.

The cozy cafe, which stays open for breakfast, lunch and dinner, is a step up from what was there before.

"It was this obviously less than charming, less than desirable location," with cigarette smokers congregating out front and trash on the sidewalk, Hebron said.

"It was definitely not good. Now there's this beautiful place where you can go for a cup of coffee between court sessions."

ANNALS OF SANDY: SHEEPSHEAD BAY BLUES

Cruel, cruel Superstorm Sandy. Its impact lingers in hard-hit waterfront Brooklyn neighborhoods even as the one-year anniversary of the killer hurricane draws near.

One of several trouble spots is Sheepshead Bay, where the storm surge combined with overflow from sewer lines to damage properties several blocks from the shoreline.

An underground stream runs beneath Sheepshead Bay Road. Many properties on the street have pumps in their basements – but the pumps were overwhelmed.

Because of foul flood waters four feet high, the big building at 1663-1671 Sheepshead Bay Road, on the corner of Voorhies Avenue, sits vacant, its storefronts locked up tight.

"It was rendered really untenable because of the mold; we had to cancel all the leases," said Ianthe Kallas-Bortz of WK New York, whose family-owned company has more than a dozen commercial properties in the neighborhood that were hurt by the storm.

Rather than do repairs at century-old 1663-1671 SBR (forgive the abbreviation; it saves space), WK New York is going to redevelop the property. It wasn't planning to do so until the leases expired in another eight years.

"The hurricane forced our hand," she said.

A liquor store, a medical office, a fur-coat seller, shoe store and deli – all gone now.

"We believe a well-designed, beautiful building can change a

neighborhood," she said. "But we're nervous."

The problem with redevelopment is it's not clear what anti-flood measures will be required.

"Nobody wants to build yet because nobody knows what's going on with FEMA and the Buildings Department," said Kallas-Bortz, whose father, Kyrie Kallas, formed WK New York's predecessor company Waldorf Realty Co. in 1962.

There's word that buildings in Sheepshead Bay are supposed to be constructed four feet above the sidewalk – but that doesn't make sense for storefronts, Kallas-Bortz thinks.

In its other Sheepshead Bay properties, WK New York was careful to tear out the floors down to the joists and remove the plaster-board above the water line to erad-

icate mold. The optical store at 1607 SBR, Eye Appeal, did its own cleanup and reopened – but later shut down because the mold sprang forth. WK New York is left with an empty storefront and a big fix-up job.

In its building next door at 1611 SBR, city Buildings Department permits have just been issued to start space renovation. It will be months before the tenant, Kings & Queens Apartments, will be able to return.

Across the street at another WK building, 1610 SBR, health food seller Forces of Nature's space was gutted, and the shop has reopened. The landlord has just now been able to get Buildings Department permits to start fix-ups of the property's two other storefronts, which now stand empty.

Throughout its Sheepshead Bay properties, the firm spent a boatload of money to do repairs – but "the lost rent is the thing that's killing us," Kallas-Bortz said.

Some of the properties had flood insurance and WK got payouts, but it wasn't enough money to cover all the fix-up bills at those buildings. And now the premiums have increased 150%.

A redevelopment project she was working on before the hurricane, at 1518 Avenue Z, is a year behind schedule because of the storm and still isn't finished.

"It would have rented sooner," she said. The hunt for tenants is ongoing.

Other Sheepshead Bay Road landlords have Sandy-spawned vacancies. The most attention-grabbing one is the site of a corporate-owned 7-Eleven, which left only its name on the outside of multi-storefront 1515 SBR.

The convenience store giant, which signed a 20-year lease, continues to pay rent, said Steven Blackburn of Premiere Properties,

to go there."

Officials at 7-Eleven's corporate headquarters in Dallas did not comment by deadline.

It cost Premiere Properties a bundle to do repairs in 1515 SBR's flooded basement, said Blackburn – who lives in Long Beach and had to move out of his home for a month because of Hurricane Sandy.

Larry Walton, whose family trust owns four Sheepshead Bay Road commercial buildings, spent \$100,000 on post-Sandy repairs. He also lost rent while the properties were being fixed up. One tenant got a temporary rent cut; another got a permanent rent reduction.

A tenant at his building 1717 SBR closed for good after Sandy – a shop called Kama Sutra with lingerie and sex toys that had stirred controversy in the neighborhood. A cell-phone store took the space. The other buildings he owns are 1721, 1725A and 1727 SBR.

Walton – whose Manhattan Beach home was storm-struck – was upset because he was turned down for an extension on his city taxes after the storm.

"We owned these properties for 50 years. We paid all our taxes," he said.

Across Sheepshead Bay Road from Walton's properties, there is a bit of promising news: Bill O'Brien brokered a lease with a cell-phone franchisee for space at 1732 SBR, where tennis shop Bay Sports closed after Sandy. And a lease is out with a lingerie shop from Bensonhurst (NOT the controversial Kama Sutra) for 1730 SBR, which has been vacant since Pelame, a furrier, closed in June 2012. The asking rent was \$35 a square foot, the broker from M.C. O'Brien Inc. said.

After years of reigning as Brooklyn's unofficial monarch, Borough President Marty Markowitz will finally be officially crowned as "King of Brooklyn" on Sunday's 39th Annual Atlantic Antic.

The crowning, taking place at the biggest and (in the opinion of many) the best street fair in New York City, will be a fitting endnote to Markowitz's three terms as leader of the storied Kingdom of Brooklyn.

The crowning takes place at 2 p.m. on the Amer-Aba stage located between Clinton and Court Street.

"The County of Kings is the greatest 'kingdom' in the land with the most swagger

to boot; don't tell anyone in Brooklyn that they aren't a king or a queen in their own right!" King Markowitz told *INBrooklyn*. "In that sense, I like to think that the Atlantic Antic is a 'coronation' for all of the 2.6 million Brooklynites that make this the greatest place to live, work and raise a family."

Even if you miss Marty's ascendancy into royalty, the over-the-top, mile-long street festival has something for everyone. During the Antic, Atlantic Avenue, from Hicks Street to Fourth Avenue, transforms into a wonderland of food, crafts, fashion, music and entertainment for all.

The event, presented by The Atlantic Avenue Local Development Corporation

(AALDC), blends new and old Antic traditions, with over 500 craft and food vendors, 100 local retailers and restaurants, and one whole block dedicated just to kids.

Many favorites have returned for the 39th year: Waterfront Ale House (with its 14-hour smoked brisket), Table 87 Coal Oven Pizza, Mile End, Steve's Authentic Key Lime Pie, and Red Hook Lobster Pound are just a few, along with Sixpoint Brewery serving up the annual Antic Amber. Free Range Wine makes their Antic debut with over 200 fine wines.

Come for the beer and stay for the music: Hank's Saloon presents Tri-State Conspiracy, a Ska band from NYC, Brandi & The Alexanders for the

R&B fans, and the Brooklyn alt-country band, I'll Be John Brown. Returning acts include French rock band Les Sans Culottes and funk soul band The Get It at the Last Exit stage, and The Winsor Terrors at the Chip Shop stage.

Also immensely popular is the traditional belly dancing on the Amer-Aba stage presented by the famous Eddie "The Sheik" Kochak.

The Kids Block, located between Boerum and Smith Street, features pony rides and face painting. Additional kids entertainment can be found at The Moxie Spot, featuring Rolie Polie Guacamole and Liam the Magician, and Gumbo featuring 'P for Puppets' and a One Woman Circus Performance by Lisa Lou.

The New York Transit Museum's 20th Annual Bus Festival will also take place during the Antic. Visitors will have the rare chance to board vintage buses and speak with bus drivers and transit historians. Only on display once a year, the vintage fleet is one of the Transit Museum's most prized collections. Over a dozen buses and trucks will be stationed on Boerum Place between State Street and Atlantic Avenue, including "Betsy" - A Fifth Avenue Coach Company double-decker bus which ran from 1931 until 1953; and work vehicles including Tunnel Wrecker, "the Monster of the Tunnels."

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2013 Brooklyn Book Festival Biggest Yet

Tens of Thousands Gathered Downtown; Marty Promises Event will Continue

"The Book Festival represents the best of Brooklyn!" Borough President Marty Markowitz told a literary crowd at Sunday's eighth annual Brooklyn Book Festival. This year's event was the biggest so far, drawing an estimated 45,000 to Brooklyn, the nation's literary hub, where over 340 renowned national and international authors appeared to read from and discuss their work.

After a weeklong series of over 60 "Bookend" events from Sept. 16 - 22, the Downtown Brooklyn festival consisted of 90-plus panels, readings and workshops spread across 14 stages. Among the venues were Brooklyn Borough Hall and Plaza, Columbus Park, Brooklyn Law School, St. Francis College, the Brooklyn Historical Society, and St. Ann & the Holy Trinity Church.

In addition to the discussions and readings, literary organizations participated by setting up booths throughout the plaza. Literary journals, booksellers, "indie" book publishers, university presses, and more reported record sales this year. Stefan Ringel, Director of Communications for the Office of Marty Markowitz, told *INBrooklyn* he was grateful for the wonderful work volunteers put in all year. "There was a lot going on, [but] everyone pitches in to make it work," he said.

Borough President Marty Markowitz, introducing Lois Lowry, the winner of the 2013 Best of Brooklyn award, the "BoBi," remarked, "Everybody wins when a festival like this wins." Pointing out that Downtown Brooklyn hotels were packed and businesses humming, he promised that the Brooklyn Book Festival, which started during his tenure, "will continue no matter who is borough president."

The St. Francis auditorium was packed with young adult fans of Newbery award-winning author Lois Lowry, this year's Best of Brooklyn "BoBi" honoree ("The Giver," "Number the Stars"). "The Giver" is my favorite book of all time," said Jennifer, 23, in town while exploring a move to New York from Colorado. "I read it first in the sixth grade. It's the book that inspired me to read."

Lowry recalled that as a high school student at Packer Collegiate in Brooklyn, her English teacher wrote on one of her papers, "Be sure to keep on writing, I think you

can do something with it." The film version of "The Giver" is now underway in South Africa; the cast includes Jeff Bridges, Meryl Streep and Brenton Thwaites as Jonas.

Lowry said that she avoids inserting a "message" in her dystopian novels. "It's the kiss of death. Kids will recoil." While not all of her novels have a happy ending, "Kids deserve an optimistic ending, some sense of hope for the future."

Sharing the panel with Lowry was Katherine Applegate, this year's Newbery Medal winner ("The One and Only Ivan," "Animorphs"). "I started writing children's books because I was stupid enough to think it was easier," she confessed. "It's extraordinarily challenging to write for kids; they can smell BS a mile away."

Carolyn Greer, director of public events and tourism for the Borough President, moderated.

Fiction was always the goal," debut novelist Caleb Crain told *INBrooklyn* in a recent interview, when asked about transitioning from his career as a literary critic to novel writing. "Criticism was just a detour that happened to take a couple of decades," he said. Speaking at one of the Festival's most popular panels featuring five of the year's most impressive debut novelists, Crain read from "Necessary Errors," a remarkable debut published this past August. Set in 1990 in newly democratic Czechoslovakia, Crain's novel chronicles the unique coming-of-age story of an American abroad.

Ayana Mathis read from her critically acclaimed novel "The Twelve Tribes of Hattie," which traces the story of Hattie Shepherd, who, in 1923, flees from Georgia to Philadelphia at age 15. She gives birth to numerous children and resolves to raise them in a manner that prepares them for the adversity she knows they'll face. When asked how she faces the terror of the empty page, Mathis answered candidly: "I don't suppose there are any tricks. You just sort of do it." And although her book turned out to be an enormous hit, she didn't set out to write a novel; the book was shaped by distinct short stories that Mathis did not intend to connect. In fact, when a friend suggested she thread her stories together into a novel, Mathis recalls that she answered, "You're so

ridiculous; I'm not writing a novel!" Also featured was Ursula DeYoung, whose enchanting book "Shorecliff" follows Richard, a teenage boy, who joins a crew of cousins, aunts and uncles in Maine during the summer of 1928. Michèle Forbes spoke about her beautiful debut "Ghost Moth," a novel set in 1969 Ireland. In the book, Katherine and George, a couple with four children, struggle to maintain a functional marriage after discovering each other's secrets. And A.X. Ahmad read from "The Caretaker," a captivating thriller about a Sikh Indian Army captain who becomes entangled in a U.S. senator's world while working on the senator's Martha's Vineyard estate.

THE FACES OF BROOKLYN

Nostalgia for an "authentic" Brooklyn of old was a theme of a panel composed of literary dynamos Pete Hamill ("The Christmas Kid"), Adelle Waldman ("The Love Affairs of Nathaniel P.") and Adrian Tomine ("New York Drawings"). Moderating was Penina Roth (Franklin Park Reading Series).

"Nostalgia is an ache for people, places and things that no longer exist," Hamill said. "I can walk there blindfolded and tell you what floor Mrs. Caputo lived on. I can see the factory where my father worked, a condo now for at least 20 years. Things inevitably change; time causes its erosions. Those erosions are where we live our lives."

LOVE, VILLAINY, ETHICS and KARAOKE

Renowned writers, pop culture geniuses and close friends Chuck Klosterman and Rob Sheffield had a lively crowd of spectators laughing as they joked about their own and each other's work. Author and *New York Times* "Ethicist" Klosterman discussed his recent book "I Wear the Black Hat: Grappling with Villains Real and Imagined," in which he reflects on his increasing tendency to relate to "antiheroes" in pop culture. "I find myself making up reasons to root for Darth Vader," he said.

Meanwhile, Sheffield spoke about

Waldman, a Brooklyn transplant, said, "I'm self-conscious that I'm not really of Brooklyn. It's a complicated issue for many of us. We're attached to a place, but contributing to change that's not always good for the people who've been here before. That said, Brooklyn has become my home."

Cartoonist Adrian Tomine, originally from California, said he, too experienced nostalgia: "For horrible strip malls, a Chinese restaurant in Oregon, things of no value to anyone." He said Brooklyn inspires his work. "There's very little translation between what I see on my walks to the market and what I put on the page."

his latest book "Turn Around Bright Eyes: The Rituals of Love and Karaoke." A sequel to Sheffield's first book, which presented a humorous yet heartbreaking account of his courtship, marriage, and sudden loss of his wife to a pulmonary embolism, "Turn Around Bright Eyes" reveals the widower's path to moving on - through karaoke.

Author Ed Park, who moderated the event, put it aptly when he noted, "Rob's book is haunted by love; Chuck's is haunted by hate...both are books that see love, hate and evil through the prism of pop culture."

POETS LAUREATE PAST AND PRESENT

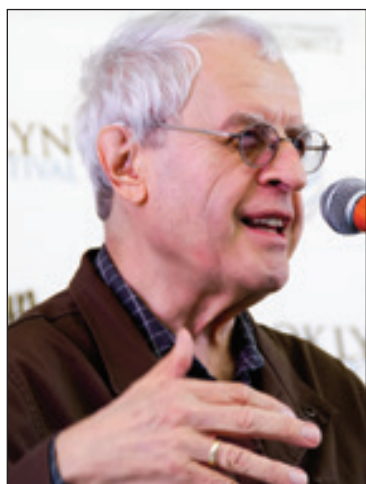

So much star power on one altar. HBO's "Bored to Death" creator Jonathan Ames joined forces at St. Ann and the Holy Trinity Church on Montague Street with Sapphire, whose book "Push" inspired the Oscar-winning film "Precious," and literary enfant terrible Tao Lin, whose new novel "Taipei" is a searingly candid portrait of the artist as a young drug user.

"I feel pretty muddled and at a loss every day, like most all of us. But there is some solace though in just trying to write," said Boerum Hill novelist Ames, who read mostly from "Wake Up, Sir!" – whose hilarious and hapless protagonist has a valet (probably imaginary) named Jeeves like in P.G. Wodehouse's novels. "Like someone tinkering with a car, I do enjoy writing sentences, and maybe getting outside myself." Sapphire, who read from her gripping new novel "The Kid" about Precious's orphaned son, revealed she's working on a book of poems.

NEW FACE, NEW RACE

Sex reassignment surgery can

change your gender – and now short-story writer Jess Row has dreamed up "racial reassignment surgery," which allows characters in his upcoming first novel to change their ethnicity. He called "Your Face in Mine," which is set for spring or summer 2014 publication, "speculative fiction" that's not exactly sci-fi. The excerpt he read in the Brooklyn Borough Hall Community Room focused on a Korean character who was having operations done in secret to become "Gwyneth Paltrow white."

Row – who said the idea of being able to change racial identity "speaks very directly to my own ex-

perience of being a white man and having desires to change my appearance to suit my own sense of white liberal guilt but also a sort of attraction to other races and cultures" – shared the spotlight with author J. Courtney Sullivan, who lives in Gowanus. She read from her riveting new novel "The Engagements."

"I write about what keeps me up at night," Paul Harding, Pulitzer Prize winning author of "Tinkers," said of his new novel "Enon," about a small-town man's efforts to come to grips with the accidental death of his only child. "Charlie, c'est moi; I lived with his grief all these years," Harding said of protagonist Charlie Crosby.

Harding told the audience at the Brooklyn Law School Student Lounge that writing about a parent losing a child is full of pitfalls – one false step would turn the story into "melodrama" or "trash." He was joined by novelists Christopher Beha, who read from his work "What Happened to Sophie Wilder, and Robert Antoni, who based his new book "As Flies to Whatless Boys" on his ancestors' 1840s voyage from London to Trinidad.

OLD AGE IS NO PLACE FOR SISSIES

Maybe there's an Alzheimer's epidemic among the 62-plus-year-olds in the emergency room at Cedars of Lebanon Hospital. Renowned writer Lore Segal handles this apocalyptic idea with deft wit and touching understatement in "Half the Kingdom," a novel Melville House in DUMBO is releasing in October.

"There is something about the world in which we live – we now live 10 or 20 years longer than we would have expected a generation ago, for

which I think we should be and we are grateful," Segal told the audience at Brooklyn Law School Student Lounge. "However, that doesn't mean medical science knows how to keep us from deteriorating." Segal's fellow panelists were novelists Fiona Maazel and Jonathan Dee, who read from their new novels "Woke Up Lonely" and "A Thousand Pardons."

SOMETHING TO HIDE: WRITERS AGAINST THE SURVEILLANCE STATE

With the National Security Agency's secret surveillance programs in the news, an eight-member panel, assembled by PEN, the American Civil Liberties Union, and the New York Civil Liberties Union read passages about the dangers surveillance poses to the freedom of writers.

Panelists included: Andre Aciman, Leonard Lopate, Francine Prose, Jeremy Scahill, Rachel Kushner, Tom Drake, Edwidge Danticat and Nick Flynn.

Scahill, National Security Correspondent for The Nation, described Ernest Hemingway's seemingly paranoid conviction, prior to his suicide, that his phone was tapped, his mail intercepted, and his bank records spied upon. Decades later, after a Freedom of Information request, it came out that Hemingway had indeed been under constant FBI surveillance.

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Changes Sweeping Through New York City Schools This Year

A number of changes are shaking up the city's school system this year. Here are a few of them:

- Schools are shifting instruction to the Common Core standards. Last spring, students took the challenging State Common Core tests, which "for the first time measured where students are on the path for success after high school, not just whether they are on track to graduate," said Schools Chancellor Dennis Walcott. Proficiency rates were dismal, with only about a third of the city's students meeting standards. More about Common Core here: <http://schools.nyc.gov/Academics/CommonCoreLibrary/ForFamilies/UnderstandingCC/default.htm>

- New principal and teacher evaluation systems have hit the

classrooms. According to Chancellor Walcott, "For the first time in nearly eight decades, teachers will have a more in-depth and consistent way of receiving feedback and support." Many teachers complain, however, the system gives more weight to high stakes test scores. In a weird twist, thousands of teachers will be rated in large part based on test scores of subjects and students that they do not teach, according to the education website Gotham Schools. (<http://gothamschools.org/tag/teacher-evaluations/>)

- Parents will soon be able to apply to kindergarten (for the 2014-2015 school year) online, Chancellor Walcott said. Parents still have the option, however, of registering their child at their neighborhood school in person, or by phone by calling 3-1-1. The new applica-

tion process is called "Kindergarten Connect." No link is available yet, but for more information, visit: <http://schools.nyc.gov/ChoicesEnrollment/Elementary/Kindergarten>

Note: If your school is overcrowded, make sure you register up in January.

Two Brooklyn schools, P.S. 222 Katherine R. Snyder School in Flatlands and P.S. 247 in Bay Ridge are among six New York City schools to receive the nationally-respected designation of Blue Ribbon Schools by U.S. Secretary of Education Arne Duncan today.

New York state recognized eighteen schools statewide as 2013 National Blue Ribbon Schools, based on their overall academic excellence or their progress in improving student academic achievement.

"Excellence in education matters and we should honor the schools that are leading the way to prepare students for success in college and careers," said Secretary Duncan. "National Blue Ribbon schools represent examples of educational excellence, and their work reflects the belief that every child in America deserves a world-class education."

"I congratulate the principals, students, teachers, and parents at these six schools for receiving this honor," said New York City Schools Chancellor Dennis Walcott. "It is a

The congregation of **Plymouth Church** gathered this weekend for a farewell celebration, taking the opportunity to honor the ministry of the **Rev. Dr. David C. Fisher** and the lasting influence and friendships that he and his wife **Gloria** leave behind. The Fishers, entering retirement, will be moving to Ohio this week. Dr. David Fisher concludes a distinguished 43-year career as a parish pastor.

The weekend's events began with a festive outdoor party at the church's Beecher Garden on Saturday evening, Sept. 21. The Plymouth congregation, friends and family gathered for dinner and a presentation of gifts to the Fishers, including a bound book of 31 of Rev. Fisher's sermons that were favorites of the congregation, entitled "A Month of Sundays." A proclamation from **Brooklyn Borough President Marty Markowitz** was read to those assembled, in which Rev. Fisher was commended for his nine years at Plymouth and "an impressive growth of membership and programs, as well as a maturation and engagement in the church's mission" during his tenure. The date of Sept. 21, 2013 was proclaimed "Rever-

end David Fisher Retirement Celebration Day" in further recognition of "his vision, fortitude and spiritual leadership, which has engaged and inspired so many in this community."

During the following morning's Sunday worship service, additional words of celebration and thanks were delivered to celebrate all the pastoral vocations in the Fisher family. Participating in the service were family members who serve in the ministry: **Rev. Dr. Karen Fisher Younger**, daughter of David and Gloria Fisher, and Professor of History at Waynesburg University in Pennsylvania; **Rev. Dr. William Younger**, son-in-law and Lead Pastor of Union Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh, PA; and the **Rev. Paul Honaker** and **Rev. Robin Honaker**, Gloria Fisher's brothers and, respectively, retired Minister of Music at Bon Air Baptist Church in Richmond, Virginia, and Senior Minister of Pilgrim Community Church in Warren, Maine.

The Rev. Karen Fisher Younger delivered the sermon at the farewell service.

Afterwards, Plymouth hosted a special reception at the church. At its conclusion,

a commissioned oil portrait of Rev. Fisher by Texas-based artist **James Tennison** was unveiled. The portrait will take its place in the church's Arcade gallery at a later date.

Dr. Fisher's Ministry at Plymouth

The Rev. Dr. David C. Fisher, Plymouth Church's tenth Settled Minister in its 166-year history, announced his retirement from the ministry this past April. His noteworthy tenure at Plymouth, the historic Congregational Church in Brooklyn Heights, began in August of 2004, with his formal installation as Senior Minister on January 10, 2005. Rev. Fisher has been a parish pastor for 43 years, as well as a noted authority on the Jewish background of early Christianity, a teacher of pastoral ministry and preaching, and a frequent speaker at clergy and denominational gatherings. Prior to Plymouth, his vocation in the ministry has taken him from small congregations in rural America to the position of Senior Minister at two of the largest and most prestigious Congregational churches in the United States: Park Street Church in Boston, MA, and Colonial Church in Edina, MN.
